AND UPON the Claimants undertaking to the Court hereafter to use its best endeavours to take such further practicable steps to notify the Defendants pursuant to the undertaking set out in Schedule 3

AND UPON any persons affected by this Order having the right to apply to vary to set aside the Order, pursuant to paragraph 15 below

AND UPON the Court having carefully considered the grounds for the Application, the evidence and any arguable defences that might be raised by the Defendants and being satisfied that the Claimants have established, on the evidence filed by the Claimants, that: (1) the Claimants have a good cause of action in relation to each of the Sites and the Access Roads, in respect of which they are likely to succeed at trial pursuant to section 12(3) of the Human Rights Act 1998; (2) the Claimants have complied with the duty of full and frank disclosure; (3) there is sufficient evidence of a real and imminent risk of tortious activity and real harm; (4) there is no realistic defence to the claim; (5) there is a compelling justification for the injunctions sought; and (6) damages would not be an adequate remedy

AND UPON the Claimants confirming that this Order is not intended to prohibit any lawful protest outside the Sites in so far as any such protest does not obstruct any of the pedestrian and vehicular entrances or exits to the Sites

AND UPON the Claimants giving and the Court accepting the undertakings set out in Schedule 3 to this Order

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

DEFINITIONS

1. “**The Sites**” means the land defined in Schedule 1 to this Order, the extent of which is shown for identification purposes coloured blue on each of the relevant plans appended to this Order in Schedule 2 (“**the Plans**”).
2. “**The Access Roads**” means the roads which provide direct access to each of the relevant Sites, the extent of which is shown for identification purposes in pink and/or orange on the Plans.
3. “**Warning Notices**” means notices in the form as set out in Schedule 5 to this Order (and warning of the existence and general nature of this Order, the consequences of breaching it, identifying a point of contact and contact details from which copies of the Order may

be requested and identifying the website address www.morrisons-corporate.com/injunction at which copies of this Order may be viewed and downloaded).

PERMISSION TO AMEND

4. The Claimants have permission to amend the claim form in order to amend the description of the Defendants and in relation to the absence of an access road to one of the sites.

INJUNCTION

5. This Order shall last until the return date, to be listed on 20 January 2025 at 2pm and shall operate with immediate effect until varied, discharged or extended by further order. At the hearing on 20 January 2025, the Court shall consider whether the Order should continue and, if appropriate, give case management directions for the progression of the claim. The Defendants and any person affected by the Order is entitled to attend the return date hearing and make representations as to the matters before the court on that date.
6. The Defendants and each of them must not do any of the acts listed in paragraph 7 of this Order.
7. The acts referred to in paragraph 6 of this Order are:
 - a. entering, occupying or remaining upon any part of the Sites without the consent of the Claimants in connection with agricultural protests;
 - b. creating or causing blockades, obstructions of traffic and/or otherwise impeding, preventing or interfering with the passage by the Claimants its agents, servants, employees, licensees, invitees to, from, with or without vehicles, including tractors or other agricultural vehicles and equipment, over and across the Access Roads in connection with agricultural protests.

9. Pursuant to CPR 6.27, and r. 81.4(2)(c) and (d), service of the Order shall be validly effected on the Defendants by:

 - b. Sending an email to the email addresses listed in Schedule 4 to this Order attaching a copy of this Order.

10. The taking of such steps set out at paragraph 8 and 9 shall be good and sufficient service of this Order and of the Claim Documents upon the Defendants and each of them.
11. 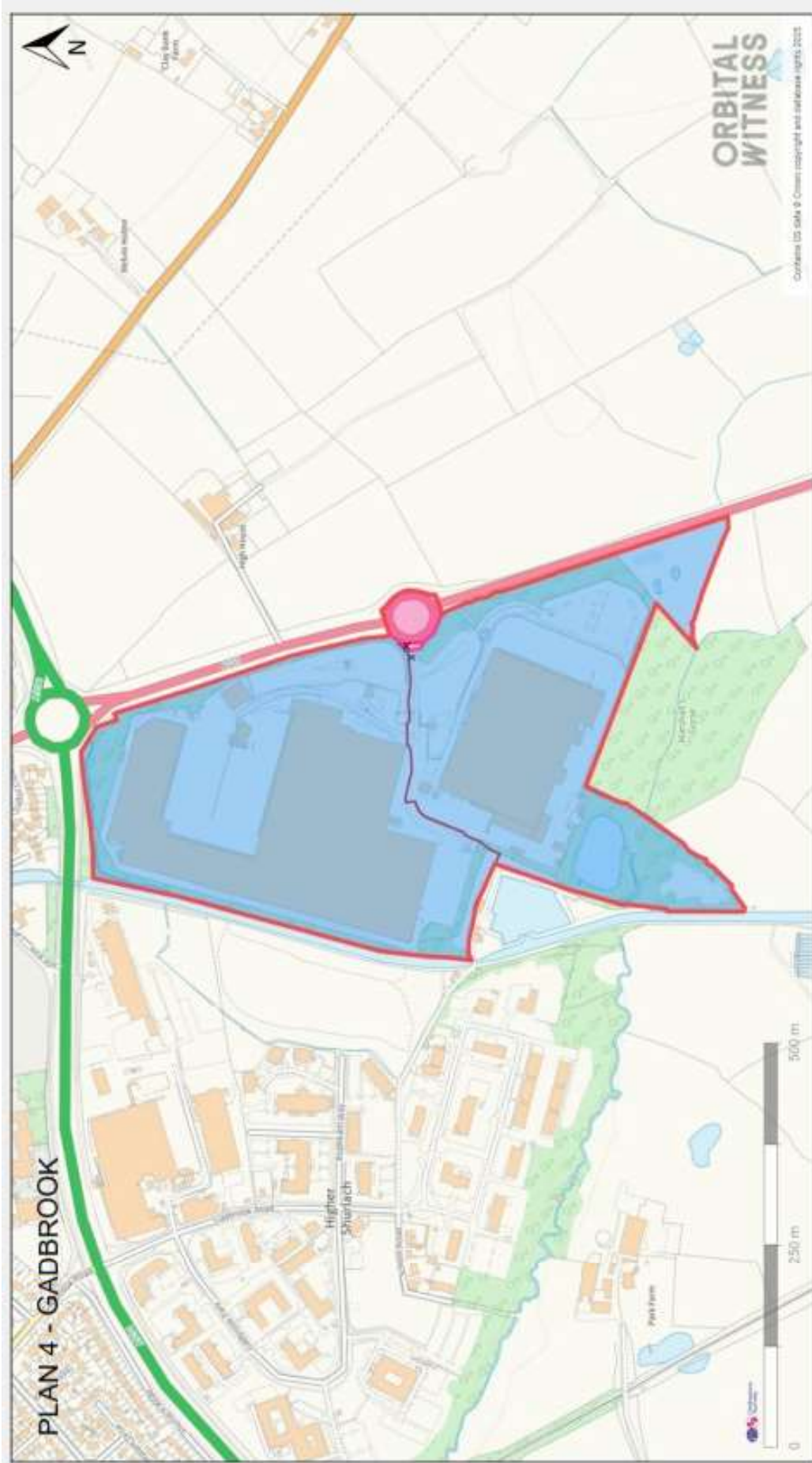


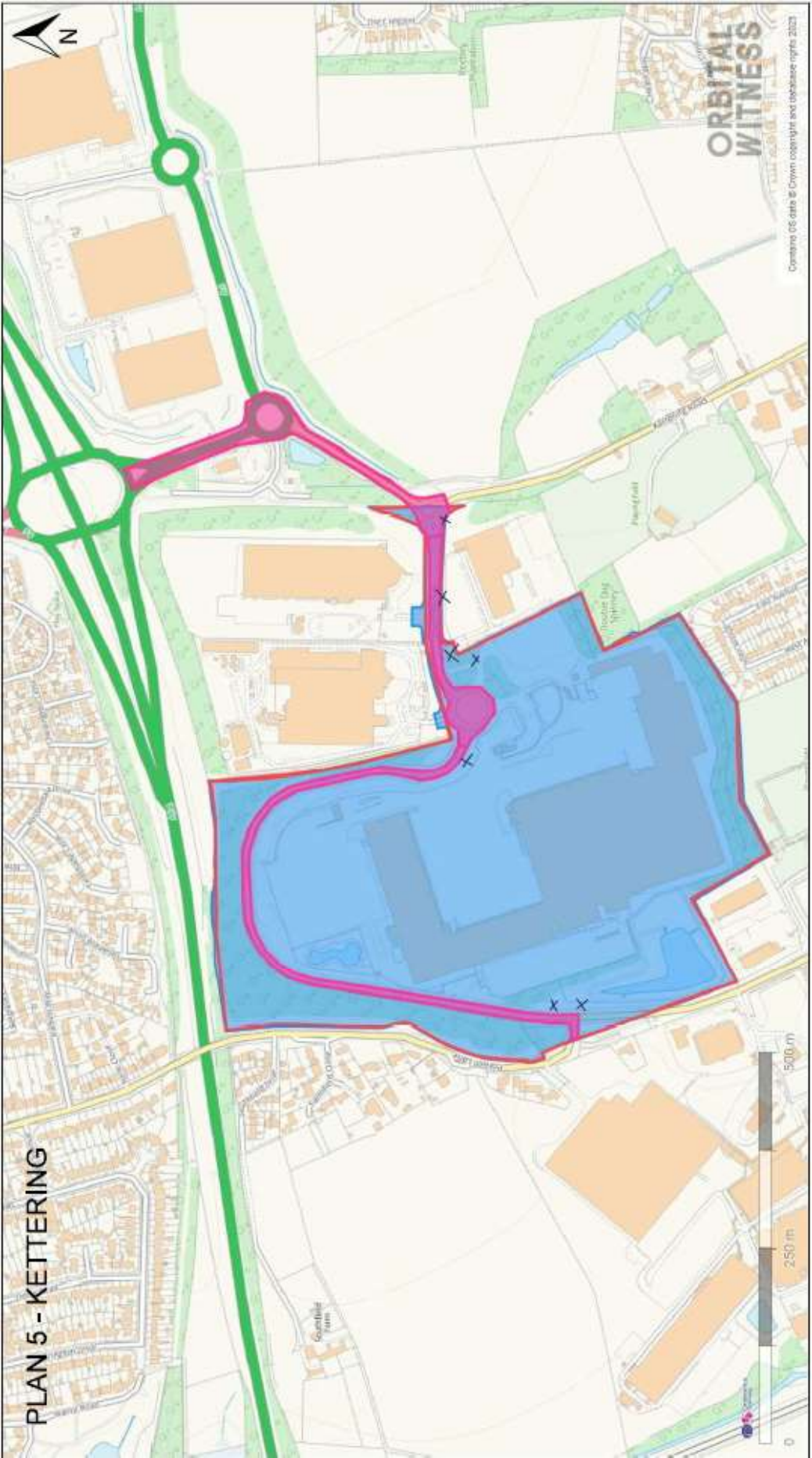


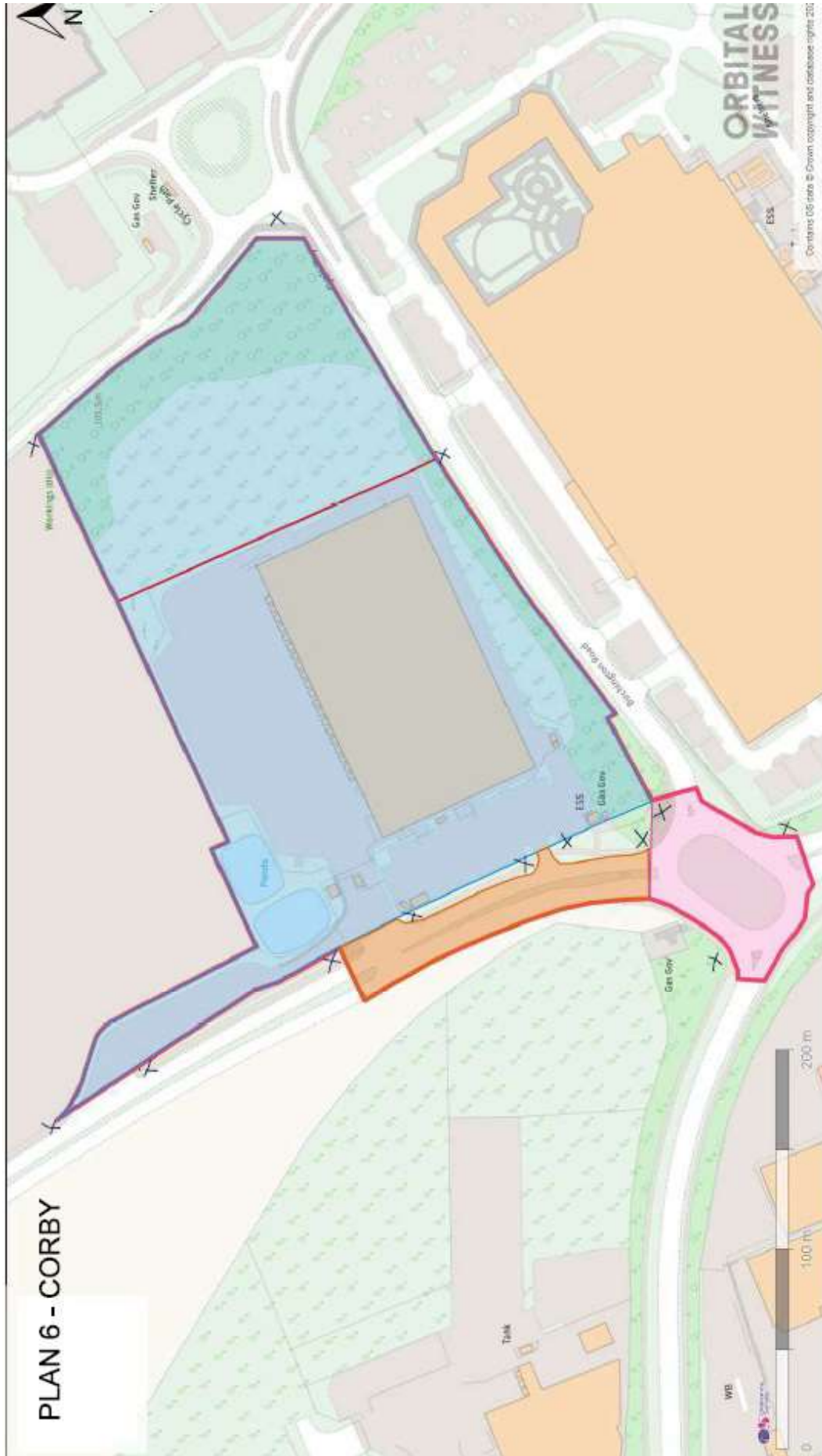


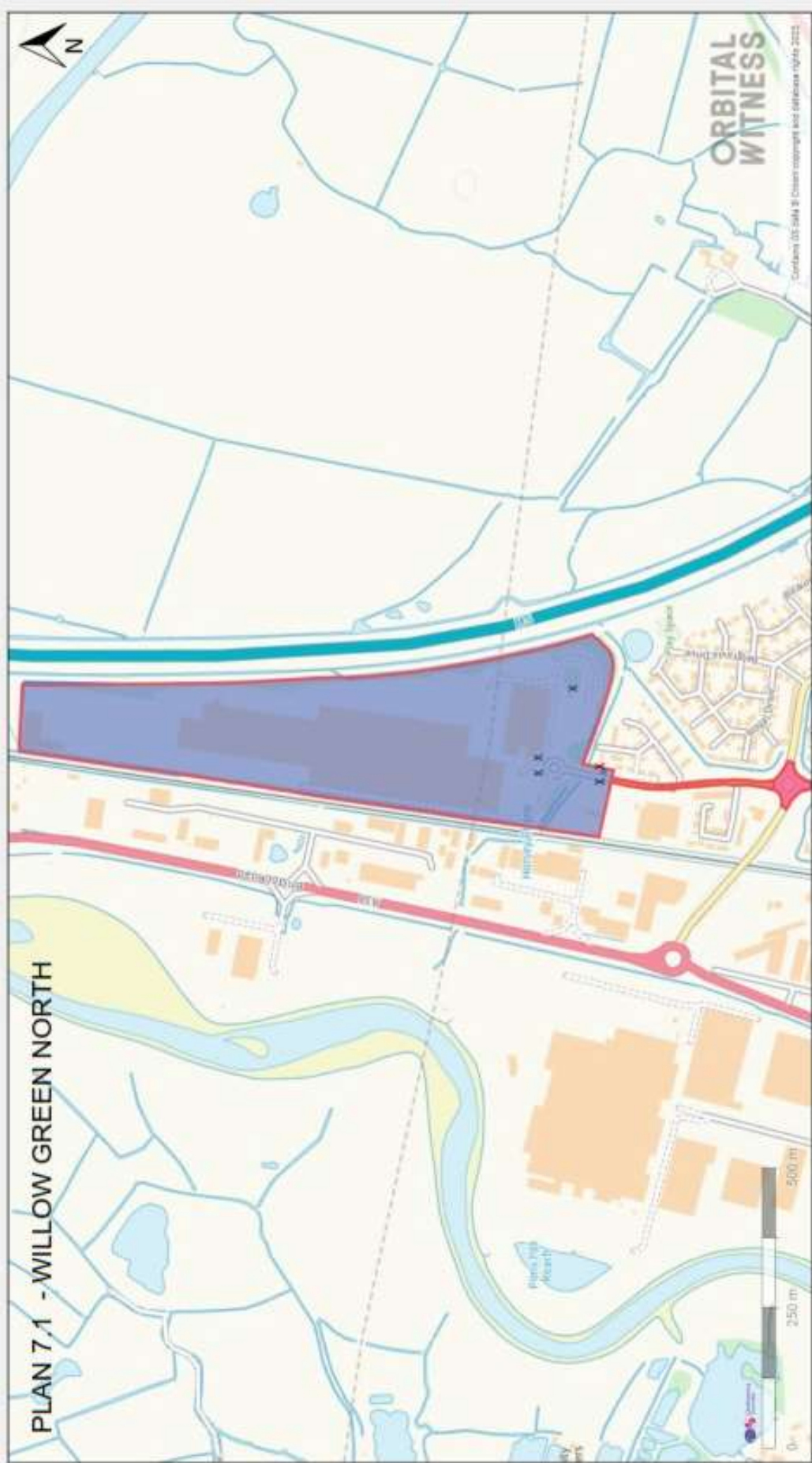




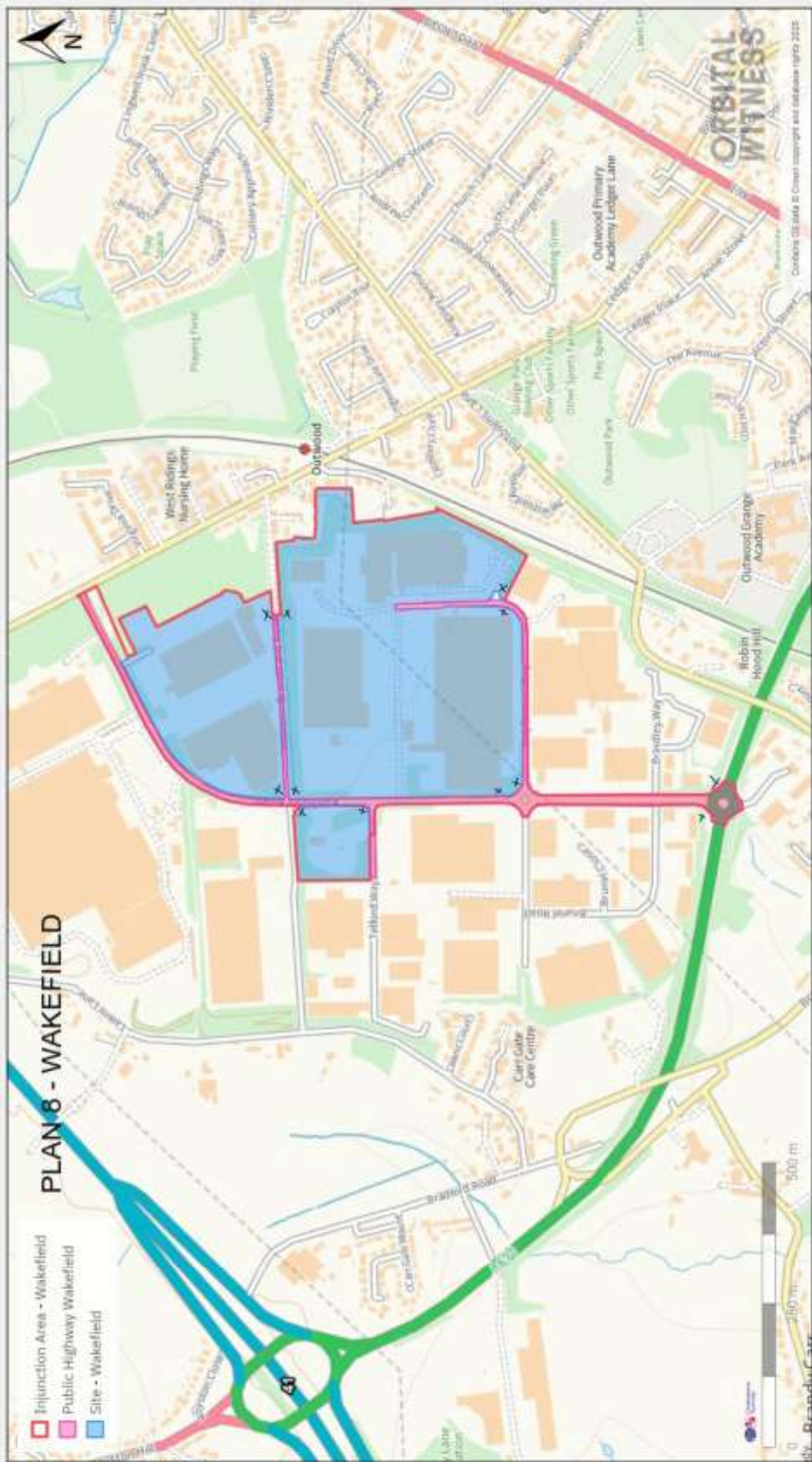












SCHEDULE 3 - UNDERTAKINGS GIVEN BY THE CLAIMANTS

Tractor convoys visit supermarkets in tax protest

A convoy of tractors is travelling to supermarkets across the South East to protest against the government's changes to inheritance tax on farms.

Campaigners have called on farmers to peacefully protest at supermarkets on Friday and talk to the public about how food production will be impacted by the changes.

In Sussex, tractors will stop at seven supermarkets between Horsham and Brighton along the A24 to speak to the public, while others gathered at Tesco in Broadstairs, Kent.

A £1m cap to agricultural property relief will come into force from April 2026 after being announced by Chancellor Rachel Reeves in the Autumn budget.

Farmer Ollie Field, from Pulborough, said: "A lot of farmers out there, if faced with this bill, would have to sell a some land in order to pay it."

Nellie Budd, from Brockham, Surrey, who was part of the Sussex convoy, added: "It would just make our farm unviable."

Claire Park, a vegetable and cereal farmer who works on a family farm in Margate, said the tax change could impact Britain's food supply.

"If we're not providing your food, we are solely reliant on other countries for our most important resource - our food," she said.

"We literally can't live without it."

Currently, working farms are exempt from inheritance tax but from April 2025 they will be liable to pay 20% on properties and land valued at over £1m.

Ms Budd added: "It's a worry for a lot of older farmers and it's leaving people in a really unsustainable situation."

A 14-tractor convoy started at Tesco at Broadbridge Heath in Horsham on Friday morning and plans to stop at Lyons Farm Retail Park in Worthing, Tesco and M&S at Holmbush Centre, Sainsbury's at Portslade, Tesco in Hove and Asda Hollingbury in Brighton.

The farmers say they plan to deliver a letter to each supermarket and chat to shoppers about how they feel the change will impact food supply.

Mr Field said: "We just don't want to upset the public - we need their support and the understanding of where their food comes from."

Meanwhile seven tractors amassed at Westwood Cross in Broadstairs.

The government told **BBC Radio Sussex** that the inheritance tax on farms is reduced from the full rate of 40%.

A spokesperson said the payments could be made over the course of 10 years and would be interest-free.

They said: "This is a fair and balanced approach which fixes the public services we all rely on, affecting around 500 estates a year."

The government says it is investing £5bn in farming over two years.

Andrew Opie, Director of Food & Sustainability of the British Retail Consortium, said: "Retailers are closely monitoring the impact of interventions, including strikes, but are adept at dealing with disruption and are working hard to ensure customers aren't impacted."

The Farming Day of Unity will bring together farmers from across the UK to participate in events in town centres to demonstrate visual support for the #StopTheFamilyFarmTax campaign and provide an opportunity for the public to add their local support.

This event will happen across Britain, from Shetland to Cornwall, and from the Giant's Causeway to Kent.

It will show MPs and ministers clearly that agriculture across the whole of the UK is united in rejecting this awful policy – a policy we were promised would never happen.

Crucially, these events are the chance for counties to do what's best for them. Each will be organised locally, and they will not all be the same.

This is members' chance to come out and be seen, to make their voices heard, and to ensure our campaign stays in both the public and media's minds.

We've put together a toolkit of information on this page that should help every event have a great, safe, effective day. This is being sent to county officeholders, regional directors, county advisers and group secretaries.

Key messages for the public



1. We just want to keep farming, producing great British food for the public, caring for the environment and being at the heart of rural communities. Thank you for your support.

2. The government consulted with nobody on this, and its data is wrong. [Up to 75% of farms will be affected](#), and for many it will be the final straw.

3. Farms can be worth a lot of money on paper, but that value will never be seen unless the farm is sold. Farm incomes are often very small. Farmers, already suffering from huge pressures, are being asked to find money they don't have to pay this tax and when they can't, their farm disappears.

How you can get involved

Here are our top tips on creating an easy-to-set-up display that will have an impact and get the message out to MPs and the public.

The tone of your event should be positive. We want to welcome the public and encourage them to support the #StopTheFamilyFarmTax campaign.

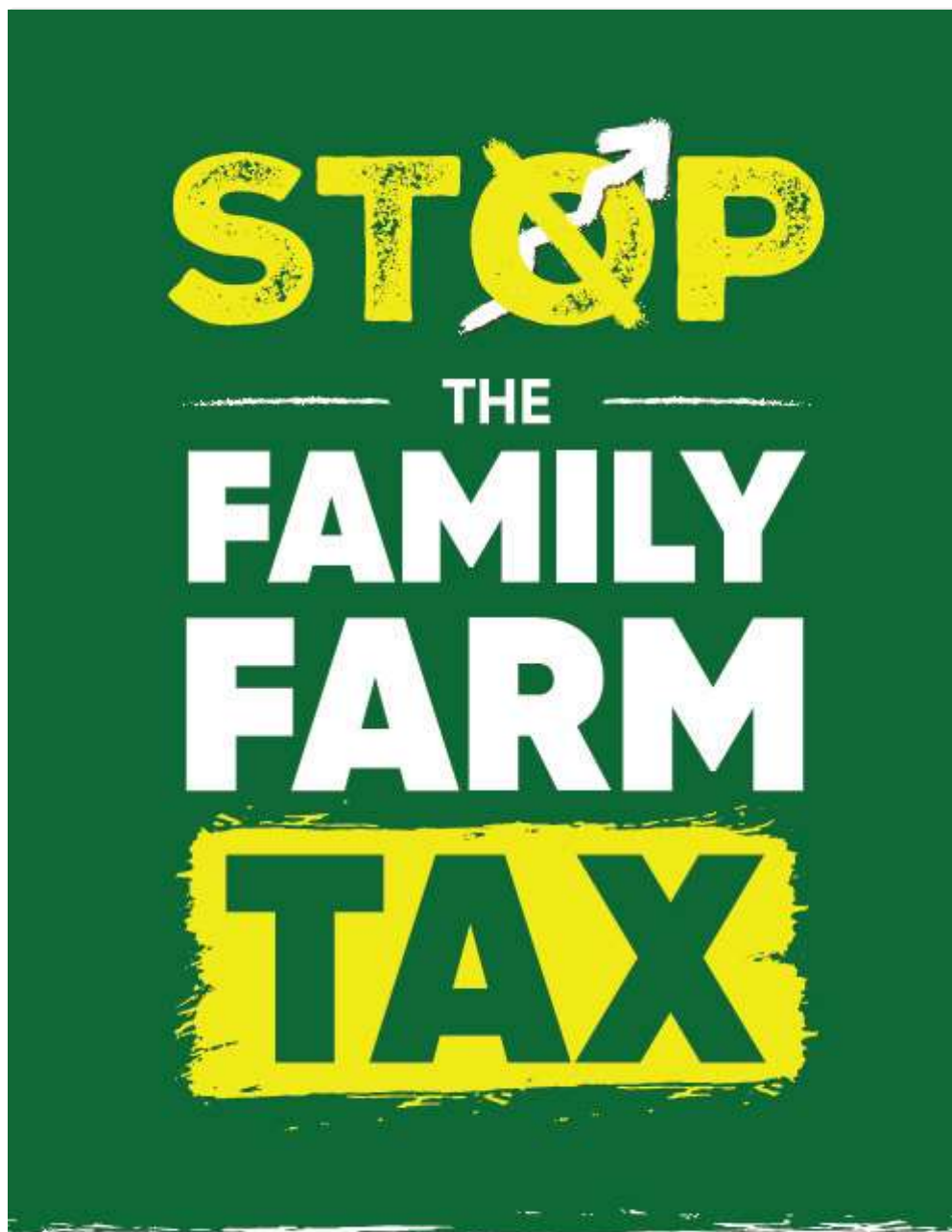
Do

- **Organise events on Saturday 25 January** through your counties – seek permission from the landowner before setting up any display on private land, and adhere to requirements set out for safe set-up and break-down.
- **Set up a display in a town centre, retail park or other public area** highlighting what you do as a farmer. This could include a display of local produce, farm machinery and food tasters but the choice for what works best on your patch is for you.
- Staff your display at all times.
- If you want to order campaign materials from the [NFU Shop](#), the last date to order is **Monday 20 January**. Material includes banners, flags, car stickers and posters. Campaign materials for members are sold at cost price.
- **Print off a campaign poster** ([poster also available in Welsh language](#)). The poster highlights 5 reasons the farm tax needs to be scrapped and will have a QR code that takes people straight to a webpage where they can add their support.
- **Provide details of your event to your regional office so they can upload information, and we can publicise them on a Farming Day of Unity map.**
- Ensure you have Public Liability insurance policy. Your county adviser will be able to advise you as to whether the NFU's public liability insurance will cover your display. Read [the guidance from NFU's legal team](#) about setting up an event. Speak to your county adviser for support with completing a [risk assessment for the event](#) (MS Word doc).
- **Promote your event.** Appoint a contact in your group to work with your [local media adviser in England](#), or your [local media adviser in Wales](#), to get maximum media coverage and [visit our social media tips and graphics page](#) to help tell your story on the day.
- Take photos of the day. [Remember to get signed permission](#) from any people in the photo if it is to be used for publicity purposes.
- Encourage any farmers you know to [write to their MP to explain the impact of this ill-thought-through policy](#).



- [Send a letter to your local MP \(letter also available in Welsh\)](#) (Rich Text Document) advising them that the event is taking place, and telling them they would be very welcome to attend.

Don't

- **Block roads or access points** – the event must not disrupt the public in their day-to-day activity. The public is not to blame for this terrible policy and we must make sure we maintain the huge support its shown us.
- Leave yourself open to inappropriate use of red diesel. If machinery is used it must be road taxed and NOT be filled with red diesel unless the event has an agricultural or charitable purpose. Some members are “charging” tractors £10 “entry” to their events and donating this money to charity, which allows them to use red diesel. This is something you might consider. 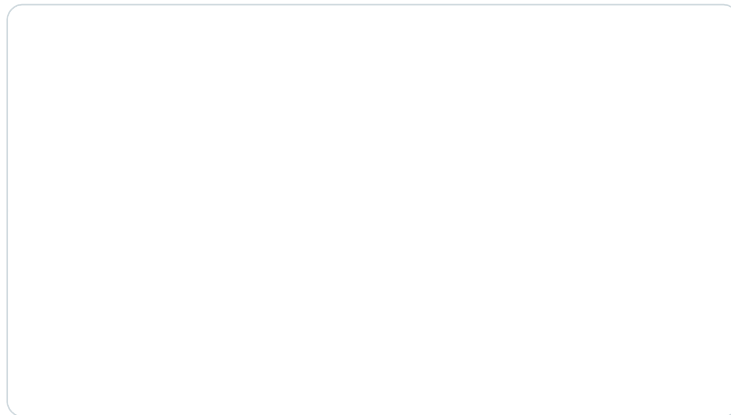

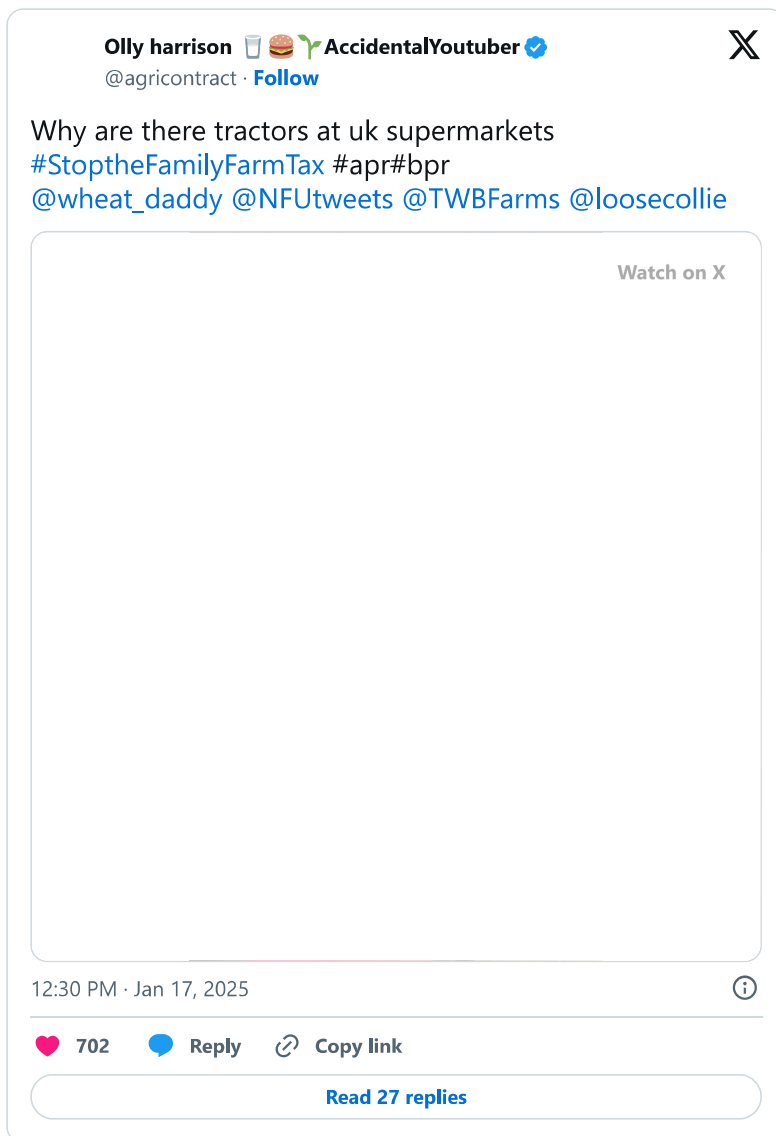

"We kindly ask if your supermarket would consider backing this initiative as well."

Farmers purposely avoided Morrisons after the firm showed solidarity with the industry in a 'we're with you' video message, which went viral on social media.

The day of action was spearheaded by the same group of farmers who organised the hugely successful London rally in November.

Olly Harrison, a Merseyside farmer who helped organise today's national protest, uploaded a video on social media explaining why it went ahead.

Under the changes announced in in the autumn budget, farmers will pay a 20% rate of inheritance tax on assets they inherit worth more than £1m.

Industry bodies claim the move could wipe out family farms across the nation, many of whom are already seeing high costs and low margins.

It comes as thirty councils across the UK have openly rebelled against the government's farm inheritance tax changes, with Labour MPs under mounting pressure to distance themselves from the policy.

Local authorities have passed motions calling on the Chancellor Rachel Reeves to 'axe the tax', which they say is an 'attack' on the countryside.

On Saturday 25 January, towns across the UK will see farmer protests as part of the industry's next steps in raising attention to the issue.

All four UK farming unions – NFU Scotland, NFU, NFU Cymru and Ulster Farmers' Union – have organised the action and will participate directly in it.
